WORKSHOP SESSIONS

Understanding new born oral structures

New born oral structures will be examined with reference to detailed diagrams and photos. Easy to understand explanations of the specific roles that these structures play in the feeding process will also be provided.

Knowing what's normal in the neonatal period

The normal stages of neonatal feeding development will be outlined, detailing the complex functions of sucking and swallowing. Functional assessment of all feeding reflexes will also be covered.

Neonates at risk

Neonates at risk of feeding problems will be identified and discussed. The impact of 'at risk' factors on breast and bottle feeding will be explored with working rationales. Risk factors discussed will include cleft lip and palate, tongue tie, respiratory distress, Down syndrome, tracheoesophageal fistula, neonatal abstinence syndrome, cardiac conditions, prematurity, gastroesophageal reflux and others.

Troubleshooting common neonatal feeding problems

Common neonatal feeding problems will be presented in a workshop type format with likely causes and suggested management planning provided for each. Scenarios will include problems such as poor attachment to the breast and/or bottle, weak sucking, difficulties coordinating the suck-swallow-breath pattern, breast and bottle refusal, coughing, choking & wet-noisy breathing, leakage and spitting of milk from the mouth, tiring or falling asleep while feeding and others. Time will also be allocated for participants to put forward cases for workshopping and management support.
